La Grulla, Texas Blas Medelez Sr., affectionately known as “Tito,” passed away peacefully on February 14, 2026, after a courageous battle with cancer. He was born on September 3, 1945, in La Grulla, Texas, to Felix and Joaquina A. Medelez. Blas grew up alongside the Rio Grande River as the second of nine siblings, where he built lifelong friendships and treasured childhood memories. Born into a family of migrant farm workers, Blas learned the value of hard work at an early age lesson instilled in him by his father shaped the course of his life. He dedicated many years as a truck driver during harvest seasons in Washington and Oregon, working tirelessly to provide for his family and ensure they had opportunities he himself never asked for. Blas was first married to Maria E. Flores, with whom he had three children and lovingly raised two more: Gloria (Noe) Zarate Sr., Eliza (Uriel) Magaña, Marisol Medelez, Blas Medelez Jr. (Veronica), and Annabell Medelez. Later, he married Dalinda A. Solis, and together they were blessed with two daughters: Linda Lizette Medelez and Amanda Nicole (Benny) De Leon. In retirement, Blas found joy in life’s simple pleasures. He cherished every moment spent with his beloved wife and life partner, Dalinda—whom he lovingly called “Mi Werita.” Together, they delighted in watching their grandchildren grow and in being surrounded by family and friends in the community they loved so deeply. He was preceded in death by his parents,

Felix Sr. (2020) and Joaquina A. Medelez (2016); his brother, Noe Medelez Sr. (2019); his daughter, Marisol Medelez (2020); his loving wife, Dalinda A. Solis (2022); and his grandsons, Blas Medelez III (2020) and Francisco Granados Jr. (2023). The loss of his “Werita” left a profound ache in his heart. In his final days, Blas was surrounded with love and compassion by his devoted daughter Amanda (“Mandita”)—his sisters-in-law and special caregivers Irene G.
