MISSION-Dr. George Thomas Stoy, 84, left to be with the Lord on January 31, 2011 at Rio Grande Regional Hospital in McAllen. He was born to Mr. Lewis Stoy and Mrs. Daisy Reese on December 27, 1926 in Madison, Kansas. He honorably served in the US Army as a PFC during World War II. He practiced Optometry for almost 40 years and was a member of the Optometric Association, K.T.A. Trap Shooting, and Shell Nob Missouri Presbyterian Church. He served as president of the K.T.A. Trap Shooting from 1969 to 1972 and was one of the most dedicated members in developing the facility. The clubhouse, 14 traps and expansions: such as camp ground and the Hall of Fame were also great assets added during his presidency. He was full of life and enjoyed joking around and playing pool; but he was serious when it came down to business. He will now be reunited with his son, Rodney Stoy, whom precedes him in death.
