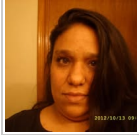

“ Mr. Rangel was my counselor while I was at JFK Elementary. While in 6th grade the powers that be decided to take me out of Mr. Vela's class because I would not stop talking. To see if my classmates were the problem they placed me in Miss. Mungia's class and things did not go too well for me. She decided that I was just a bad student and treated me badly. A bunch of boys dumped a glass full of red ants in her aquarium that housed a horned toad and baby snake. Unfortunately, the snake died from the ant bites and she blamed me. Even though I was reading at a high school level she insisted I had to read at a fourth-grade level because that is where the rest of her class was at and she didn't want me to make them feel bad. Not to mention even though I hate math and was already doing long division she refused to let me and would say again I had to be with her class. I would get aggravated and grab my books and run down to the office and into Mr. Rangel's office and complain. The first time I walked in I told him what was going on and he would just smile and shake his head. He asked me to sit in his office and he left. I found out about ten minutes later he went to Mr. Vela's class and got the book I was at in his class and my math worksheet and had me do them in his office. Every time I ended up in his office he would do this for me. The final straw for him was when I showed up crying and told him that Miss. Mungia had thrown away my purse because one of the girls in the class told her I had lipstick and mascara. Now being in sixth grade it was really just lip gloss and clear mascara.

I assured Mr. Rangel that I didn't take it out in class and only used it in the bathroom. He told me he was glad I did not use it in class and that he would go talk to her at the end of the day. When I got to the high school my mom asked about my purse and when I told her what happened she was mad and we ended up at the office at JFK. My mom had them pull in Miss. Mungia and while she was talking with her Mr. Pena our Principle, and Mr. Saenz the vice-principle Mr. Rangel told me that I would not be going back to Miss. Mungia's class. That he talked to Mr. Vela and that he was willing to take me back in his class if I promised to be quiet. I told him I will try. He just smiled and told me don't worry. I told Mr. Vela that if you get too

talkative and active to send you here and you can do your work here and I would help you. Would you like that? I smiled up at him and told him yes.

After that day I didn't spend too many days with him because I didn't want to disappoint him by talking in class but when I did end up in his office to do my work I was always really happy. Sometimes I would ask Mr. Vela if I could go to his office just to spend time with him.
